Comment:

Comment and suggestions:

- Dr. C. Hariprasad mentioned that the use of terms 'institute level' could cause confusion. It is possible that there could be achievements that are at national level events held in the institute. To make sure there is clarity, Ms. Deepa Panakkal suggested words like intracollegiate / inter-collegiate' could be used instead.
- Mr. Sunil Pansare mentioned that the weightage given to 'Internships' in the form can be capped to certain level. For branches like computer and information technology, ample online internship opportunities are there but in case of other branches, online opportunities are fewer. So, weightage to internships should not be considered in terms of numbers rather quality aspect should be prioritized.
- The Director, Bro. Shantilal Kujur, mentioned that while the scenario of internship opportunities for each branch might be different, we need to work out ways and plan means as to make sure that all students from various branches could bag better internship opportunities.
- All members suggested that an appropriate capping of all parameters is essential to make sure the criteria remain quality oriented and not quantitative alone.
- Dr. Uday Khot mentioned that a certain criterion covering aspects of 'entrepreneurship' and values and ethical approach' should also be incorporated in the form. These being the core values of our Vision statement, it is only fair that the best outgoing student should be assessed on these parameters as well.
- Mr. Lester Fernandes appreciated the efforts put into framing of the form. He appreciated the fact that the form included a combination of academic aspects and extracurricular activities.
- Dr. Kavita Sonawane suggested that the students should be made aware of all the parameters right from the First Year so they can work towards it. It can serve as a motivation to students.
- Mr. Conrad Frank suggested that more weightage could be given to research and publication as it aids possibility of real-life solutions. This aspect is essentially important from industry perspective. Also, let us make sure that the academic topper does not automatically end up being the best outgoing student. We must encourage nurturing of all the vital parameters in students in such a way that we end up with a tough decision with a pool of students to choose from.

ITEM 3.4: Discussion on Best Practices

- Given the score received from the NAAC peer team, Best Practices are at approx. 55%. Hence the proposal to revisit the guidelines and evaluate the practices in a concrete way.
- A rubric with all major guidelines incorporated was presented for evaluation of best practices. While the basic framework of rubrics has been designed, framing of specific performance indicators and targets to measure and assess might be a good way to evaluate the selection of practices.

Comments and Suggestions:

- Mr. Sunil Pansare sought clarity in terms of what NAAC means when it states "context free and less subjective" with regard to best practices. Ms. Deepa Panakkal clarified that the focus is more on quantifiable data. It is expected that the institute sets specific targets and showcases its process, planning, execution and monitoring along with results in quantifiable terms without leaving it open to subjective interpretation.
- Mr. Wilson Pinto and Dr. Nitika Rai mentioned that the possibilities of getting specific quantifiable data would rest on laying down specific strategies that need to be adhered to.
- Mr. Lester Fernandes Dr. Sincy George mentioned that we can work on specific strategies and frame specific performance indicators relevant to each parameter for evaluation of selected best practices.
- Dr. Kevin Noronha mentioned that using the valuable inputs we shall propose the indicators in the next meeting.

ITEM 5: Any other point with the permission of the chair

Dr. C. Hariprasad raised a concern with regard to duplication of various documents due to different formats (ISO, IQAC, etc.)/ difference in same formats in various departments. This costs time to faculty and adds to their work. He suggested that a common approach and uniform format aligned in a manner that it could be incorporated directly into ERP using Mr. Johnson's help would be useful. Linking ERP to course file is a possibility that should be explored.

 Dr. Deepak Jayaswal mentioned that the work on streamlining all documents in a uniform manner has already been initiated and Mr. Johnson is also on it. It may take some time to stabilize but the work is on. Dr. Nitika Rai mentioned that changes in ISO formats take a procedure. But that is being discussed and possibility is being explored to have single format for specific documents.
